## Introduction



Through near-death experiences (NDEs), humanity now has thousands of documented cases of transcendent encounters that transform the experiencer's life and in which consciousness may appear to exist independent of the physical body. The International Association for Near-Death Studies (IANDS) is the only international organization dedicated to encouraging thoughtful scholarship and scientific research into the nature and implications of these experiences—physical, psychological, social, and spiritual; to educating about NDEs; and to supporting near-death experiencers and people close to them.

Recently, the organization has embarked on a series of strategies to disseminate the growing body of research indicating strongly that the NDE cannot be explained by physiology or pharmacology alone. It is critical that this research reach a broader audience, including scientists, medical professionals, religious thinkers, and the general public.


Meanwhile, many people apparently outside the context of imminent death or clinical crisis report experiences involving virtually identical elements and aftereffects as NDEs. These near-death-like experiences may signify unrecognized moments of clinical emergency but also occur in times of emotional extremes or at the deathbed vigil of a loved one. Though descriptions of these experiences have existed throughout human history, they have become a focus of renewed interest.

While experiencers sometimes struggle to adjust, they usually feel a need to discuss the NDE and its aftermath but often have difficulty finding others in whom to confide. They, their caregivers, and others close to them feel in great need of information and support.

Since its founding in 1981, IANDS has been the central address for research and education about the NDE. The organization has expanded to include an international network of local interest groups, quarterly publishing of a newsletter and the peer-reviewed *Journal of Near-Death Studies*, and periodic conferences that afford the opportunity for near-death experiencers, researchers, and the public to interact and discuss significant issues and new understandings.



# Milestones



Among IANDS most important accomplishments are these:

- since 1981, consultant to all network and cable morning and evening news and feature programs throughout the U.S. and Canada, major talk shows, film producers, and countless magazine and newspaper reporters, providing information, research references, and referrals to near-death experts and experiencers
- 1981, inauguration of the quarterly newsletter *Vital Signs*.
- 1982, inauguration of the scholarly, refereed quarterly *Journal of Near-Death Studies*.
- 1982, first local support and interest groups; as of 2006, 45 in the U.S. and 10 outside the U.S.
- 1982, first medical seminar, Yale University School of Medicine
- 1984, first NDE research and clinical conference, Pembroke Pines, Florida
- 1985, first public conference, with Elisabeth Kubler-Ross at University of Connecticut
- 1989, institution of regularly scheduled conferences
- 1995, debut of an informational website, still expanding its services
- 2002, publication of the scholarly research tool, *Near-Death Experiences: Index to the Periodical Literature*, on CD-ROM, indexing all scholarly and many non-scholarly articles addressing NDEs; updated in 2006
- 2005, distribution to U.S. medical schools of *The Day I Died*, an hour-long BBC production about the most compelling cases of NDEs and current research on NDEs
- 2006, research conference observing the first 30 years of NDE research, University of Texas M. D.
  Anderson Cancer Center

# How we accomplish our mission:

**Research** Through the *Journal of Near-Death Studies*, work with authors to promote the use of scientifically valid research protocols, publish findings, encourage investigations in diverse disciplines, and enable informed discussion and examination of NDE-related topics. Through conferences and other programs, we look for opportunities to collaborate with other organizations having research interests.

**Education** Expand program offerings for the scientific, academic, medical, therapeutic and spiritual/religious communities and for the public at large. Continue building a library of information addressed to people facing death, and to their loved ones and those who assist the dying and the grieving. Incorporate NDE-based knowledge into publications and programs for suicide prevention, for the easing of grief, and for the discovery of meaning and purpose in life.

**Support** Advocate and provide support for NDErs and NDLErs, assuring them that their experience is a normal, valid, and common phenomenon. Assist experiencers, their families, their caregivers, others close to them, and local support groups in the process of integrating these experiences into their lives.

# Values

- **Beneficence:** We pursue and use information about near-death and near-death-like experiences to promote the welfare of all forms of existence.
- *Responsibility*: We promote balanced, research-based and thoughtful views about near-death and near-death-like experiences.
- *Inclusivity:* We welcome various disciplines and viewpoints in the search for greater understanding of near-death and near-death-like experiences.



- *Nonpartisanship:* Where research does not indicate a reasonably clear position, we remain impartial.
- *Community:* We promote connection between, and support for, people interested personally and/or professionally in near-death and near-death-like experiences.

# **Research Goals & Objectives:**

Research Goal #1: Sponsor research on NDEs/NDLEs and provide the most current data for IANDS researchers and others.

# **Annual Objectives:**

#### 2007

- To identify stakeholders and funding sources for current prioritized research areas:
  - 1. Cross-cultural field studies on NDE incidence, nature and aftereffects, particularly in non-Western cultures .
  - 2. Combat experience aftereffects and educational interventions
  - 3. Update of U.S. statistics on NDE incidence, demographics and aftereffects
  - 4. Methods of applying the NDE to prevent suicide, alleviate grief and reduce death anxiety in the general population.
- To prioritize other issues suggested for IANDS-sponsored research, such as:
  - What more can be learned about shifts in electrical sensitivities following an NDE/NDLE?
  - o Are there contributing factors for radiant and terrifying experiences?
  - o How do aftereffects of childhood and adult experiencers compare?
  - o What are the implications of the NDE for religious communities?
  - What are the aftereffects of other transcendent/transpersonal experiences compared with those of the NDE?
  - o What are the messages contained in NDEs/NDLEs, and how do they affect experiencers?
  - o What are the changed beliefs in NDErs/NDLErs by religious background?
  - o What are the implications of NDEs as compared with.NDLEs?
- To provide students with mentors to assist and promote NDE research.
- To update the *Near-Death Experiences: Index to the Periodical Literature.*

#### 2008

- To invite requests for proposals to pursue priority research questions
- To develop an online database of funding resources for NDE researchers

#### 2009

- To complete NIH research grant proposal on near-death experiences
- To inform academic institutions about support for dissertations in the field of NDE/NDLE research.

# **Long Term Objectives:**

- To publish results of selected research questions
- To offer competitive grants to researchers.
- To provide fellowships/scholarships for research
- To coordinate and share findings with other organizations using database analyses.

# Research Goal #2: Upgrade the state-of-the art tools and methodology for science-based research.

# **Annual Objectives:**

#### 2007

- To bring the current database of NDE reports up to commercial standards.
- To review status of archives for availability to researchers.
- To revise the current questionnaire to conform to the Greyson scale and incorporate recent findings in the NDE field.
- To complete internet NDE survey tool.
- To initiate an online NDE narrative repository.

#### 2008

• To put the *Near-Death Experiences: Index to the Periodical Literature* through 2007 online to maximize its availability to researchers and other interested persons.

#### 2009

• To develop a formal assessment of the needs of experiencers and their families.

# **Long Term Objectives:**

• To expand NDE database to incorporate multi-lingual data.

Research Goal #3: Enhance collaboration with organizations that have credibility within the scientific, healthcare, spiritual/religious, and academic communities.

# **Annual Objectives:**

#### 2007

- To update list of research contacts
- To cultivate research connections by sponsoring and speaking at relevant organizations.
- To explore collaborations with relevant foundations, universities, and non-profits, such as Templeton Foundation, IONS, the Rhine Research Center, and Fetzer, involved in scientific research on the nature of consciousness, spirituality, etc.

#### 2008

- To develop a list of institutional collaborators
- To explore alliance with other professional/spiritual/religious organizations that support physicians, nurses, grief counselors, psychotherapists, physicists, clergy, etc.

## 2009

- To identify and develop collaborations with scientists in fields which are concerned with an explanation for the near-death experience, such as quantum physics and neurophysics.
- Sponsor a collaborative forum on priority research issues.

## **Long Term Objectives:**

- To conduct and publish collaborative research projects.
- To hold collaborative conferences on selected research issues.

Education Goal #1. Provide most current information to healthcare providers, medical, religious and academic professionals.

# **Annual Objectives:**

#### 2007

- To collect, publish and disseminate the proceedings of the IANDS Conference at MD Anderson
- To create a 5-hour internet-based CEU program for counselors/psychologists
- To produce specialized CEU program modules for nursing, pastoral care
- To plan for a conference in 2008
- To finalize the Road Show as two-hour CEU program with evaluation form for healthcare providers.
- To post bibliography online.

#### 2008

- To launch at the IANDS website the 5-hour internet-based CEU program for psychologists and counselors
- To create an online area at the IANDS website for professionals
- To revise existing brochures/website

- To develop brochure/webpage on uncommon aspects of the NDE, such as pleasurable dark experiences

• To develop brochure/webpage to address spiritual aspects of NDEs/NDLEs
